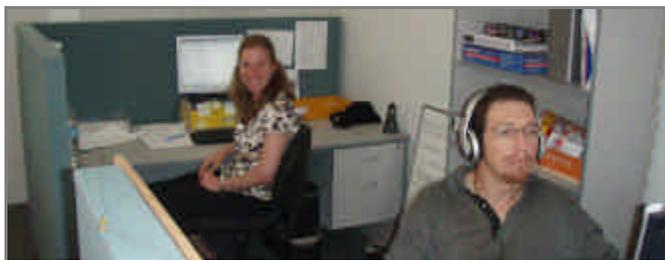

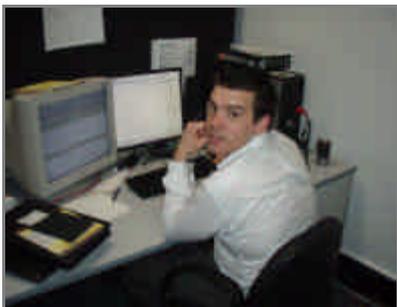
The Testing Unit is part of the Development team of PHS. The role of the Testing Unit is to manage and conduct all matters relating to testing of all software developed by PHS.

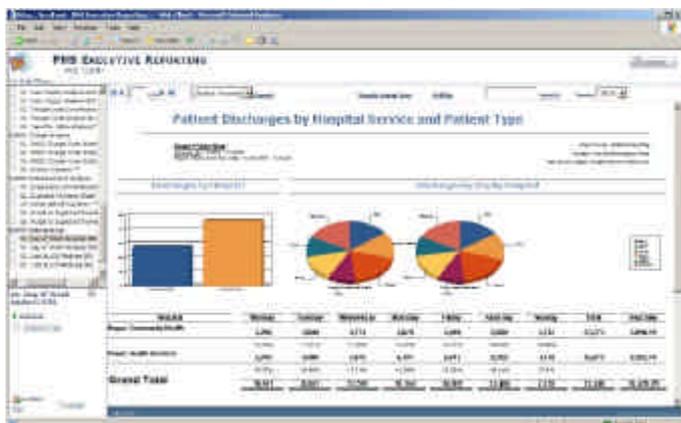

Build Performance

- Over time, files on PC hard drives can get fragmented (spread out over the hard drive). When this happens, it takes longer for to access files, and slows down the system. *IT Departments should occasionally de-fragment hard drives as this will improve performance.*
- Site backups should be scheduled not to run at the same time as the Report Layer build as this can cause the Report Layer build to fail.
